
The show will also feature a live band made up of our own musicians and lots and lots of splurge!

Challengers are looking to reach out to families with children and young people living in the Kingston and Richmond Boroughs, who would be interested in attending Challengers Play and Youth Schemes.



75 Memorials – A Community Remembers

January 2020 will see the 75th anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau. In commemoration of this landmark anniversary, London Borough of Richmond Upon Thames is launching an exciting new project for schools, community groups and individuals.

Participants can take part in the project by creating artworks, prose and poetry, inspired by the stories and events of the Holocaust. Pieces can respond directly to one person's experiences, or be a broader commemoration of the Holocaust, or reflect on the national theme for HMD2020: Stand Together.

This opportunity is open to everyone who works, lives or studies in the borough and there is no upper or lower age limit.

75 pieces will be chosen to be displayed in an exhibition at The Landmark Arts Centre in January 2020.

London Irish Girls 6th Form Rugby Academy

London Irish are delighted to announce that they have launched the London Irish Girls Rugby Academy in partnership with Bishop Wand School.

The London Irish AASE (Achieving Academic and Sporting Excellence) scheme has been running for over 10 years for boys in years 12 and 13, to give them the opportunity to follow their rugby aspirations alongside academic study at Bishop Wand School sixth form.

Following the success of the AASE programme, London Irish are thrilled to have launched a scheme aimed at girls. It will be one of only four of this kind of programme for girls in London and the South East, combining academic studies with an elite training programme, including strength and conditioning and nutritional support.

The programme will develop and support young female rugby players alongside their club commitments.

There are 26 places available and first intake of the London Irish Girls Rugby Academy will be made up of year 12 and 13 students for 2020/2021. The girls will compete in the AoC Leagues and cup competition, and at local and national Rugby 7s events including Rosslyn Park.
