





Another reason is borders; we have chosen to be border-free but going on holiday or just a simple business trip could take twice as long to organise. But finally the economy would be absolutely awful if we left the EU.

Sports Day


Sports day will take place on Tuesday 12th July at Teddington Rugby Club. All students will take part in one event each and there will also be an inter-form tug-of-war!
